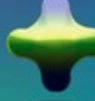

A kinetic visual novel, curiously referred to by its developer as a "game". As a strong and frequent advocate of walking simulators and such, even I'd opine that a product in which you click through a linear story and never once make anything resembling a choice is not really a "game".

It is, however, a fairly interesting and by-and-largely well-written short story (though the end was a tad abrupt for my liking). So is the unorthodox audio-visual presentation of a visual novel justified? I would say so, yes. It arguably makes for a more immersive experience, though some literary purists would no doubt argue that the text should be doing that job for itself. Each to their own I'd say, and I certainly can't fault someone for trying something new in this artistically-saturated day and age.

This said, the otherwise excellent choice of music does go a little askew in the story's final act. There are also some...odd visual choices which I'll leave you to discover and ponder upon for yourself. They certainly increase the sense of enigma already inherent in the narrative. Whether I would have opted for these choices myself is another matter entirely.

I can certainly recommend this to anyone who enjoys a dark, slightly surrealistic story. Is it worth three dollars? Hmm...I guess the question is whether or not you're the kind of person who would pay that much money to read a 5000 word short story written by an author you're unfamiliar with. I generally wouldn't, so I'd probably say wait for a sale.

Verdict: 6/10.

In the rugged, frontier days of the Internet 1.0 waaaaay back in the late 90s, one game was widely recognized in middle school computer labs across the country: Space Penguin. It was a quaint, plucky game with the simple goal of launching a penguin via slingshot into a black hole, assisted by planetary gravity along the way. My nostalgia had me thirst for a new Space Penguin for the modern age, and that's when I found Luna's Wandering Stars.

While the first world, Mercury, gave me the Space Penguin slingshotting I missed, I then learned with Venus that LWS is actually 9 games in one. Each planet (Yes, including Pluto) brings a new mechanic that manipulates you (the moon) in different ways. From Saturn's power to shriek and grow your mass at will, or Mars letting you shoot at obstacles, players are bound to find a favorite section of the game that will win them over. Come for the inadvertent planetary destruction, stay for the addicting quest to collect all the golden asteroids.. Duration: estimated 30-40 hours for this DLC.

This is possibly the biggest, grandest and most polished single DLC I've played for Panzer Corps. It spans the entire war from the Soviet perspective and has up to 24 successive missions.

Many of the maps had interesting elements not encountered in previous DLC. Special rules such as the shrinking map of Stalingrad, Flooding the Elbe, Sewer Movement, even a fighting withdrawal which was very unique for the series. Successive missions contained quite a bit of variety creating excitement to continue the campaign. From grand tank battles to urban slugfests. If you enjoy Panzer Corps, you need to play this DLC.

The one annoyance was that after taking Berlin you can choose either a final hypothetical battle against the Western Allies or Japan. So, I simply replayed the final turn of the Fall of Berlin and saved my game so I could play both scenarios.

Highly recommended. =). This game is a bad mixture of monotonous inventory management and repetitive combat combined with an extremely punishing "one bad thing kills you" and a forced ironman game-saving scheme. This results in making the game super boring to play most of the time, until inevitably you get complacent or caught off guard in a bad situation and then just die and lose all your character progress. For most people, this also means that a lot of the game is pretty much out of reach, since it takes a lot of experience grinding and material gathering to get deeply into the crafting system. Always being at risk of losing everything actually does provide some sense of dread and terror in the game, and this is the neurological trick that makes you to want to play, but that does not make the game fun, it's just a psychological effect.

If you disagree, I'd recommend you try copying the save directory to see how the game plays once you have the ability to save and load at will. You quickly realize how boring the game really is without the artificial high stakes.. Next to the Age of Charlemagne add-on, this is the culture-pack to get. Having started out either building an army and having revolts on my hands, or trying to remain at peace and having neighbors harassing me, this was where I should have begun to understand the dynamics of this game. The Picts have got to be one of the best groups since you are buffered by the Caledonians, and a natural ally of the Ebdanians (Oirish), and you get a chance to start working with the politics, technologies and building up a city without getting clobbered consistently. With very little effort, you can unite with the other two factions and take over all of Britain, and then start hitting the mainland. The mix of combatants is excellent and gives a completely unique feel to the combat possibilities. You can carry on raids, ambushes, sieges while using the seas for hit and run raids, so it's the best of all worlds medieval. Allying with large armies of Caledonians is great, since if you are new you get a feel for the tactics and can make goofy mistakes without losing your army. All in all this culture-pack is like a game within the game, and really is a great learning tool plus a lot of fun if you like crazy units in combat and slash and burn raids.

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
